

MAIN STREET ADVISORY BOARD OFFICERS POSITIONS DESCRIPTIONS

Per our bylaws, officers shall be nominated by the Organization Committee and voted on at the January meeting. Term of office shall be one year. Officers may serve unlimited terms.

The Board shall elect from among its membership the following officers with the following duties and responsibilities for one (1) year terms:

President – To preside over all meetings, to work with the Main Street Manager to develop meeting agendas, to perform other duties normally associated with a Board Chairman.

Vice-President – To preside at the meetings in the absence of the Chairman.

Secretary/Treasurer – To maintain the official records of the Board, serve as custodian of the books and records of the corporation and any funds owned by the corporation.

The President and Vice-President are exempt from the three (3) year term limit in order to serve in the natural progression of President and Past President. This allows the organization to have continuity in leadership. They will remain a voting member as long as they are on the board.

Per our bylaws, the Program shall have at least four (4) permanent committees including but not limited to: Organization, Design, Promotion, and Economic Development. The basic goals, responsibilities, and functions of these committees shall be as identified by the Texas Main Street Program and as directed by the Board to customize the Texas Main Street Program to be applicable to Hamilton. Each permanent committee shall consist of at least (5) members comprised of Board members and community volunteers.

- 1) **Organization** - builds partnerships among the various groups that have a stake in the district; takes a leading role in community education, public relations, and fundraising efforts.





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
