

What is Hamilton Historic Main Street?

Hamilton gained Main Street accreditation in 2020. The local program entails the Hamilton Historic Main Street Advisory Board, Main Street Manager, and four committees comprised of local volunteers. Hamilton City Council and Hamilton EDC support the program as it works closely with our downtown business and property owners, Hamilton Chamber of Commerce, Hamilton County Historical Commission, and other local organizations.

Our Vision: The Hamilton Historic Main Street program preserves and enhances Hamilton’s history and historic architecture to be an inviting destination for small businesses, residents, and tourists to eat, play, shop, and explore.

Our Mission: We will utilize the Main Street principles of Organization, Promotion, Design, and Economic Vitality to preserve Hamilton’s small-town charm, promote our businesses and attractions, and encourage small business growth in our community.

What can I do?

The Hamilton Historic Main Street Program works through four standing committees comprised of local volunteers. Come join us!

- **The Design Committee** guides preservation and beautification in the Main Street District.
- **The Promotion Committee** markets the program area as a cultural, entertainment, culinary, and business destination through events and other initiatives.
- **The Economic Vitality Committee** explores incentives for businesses and business recruitment and retention.
- **The Organization Committee** extends public relations and volunteer outreach.

The Hamilton Historic Main Street Program is a grassroots, volunteer-driven effort to preserve and revitalize the historic core of our community, and it needs your time and talent to succeed.


